WARNELLA'S STORY

I am thankful because God did not forget about me, didn't leave me out there. He gave me another chance to live a new and better way of life, a life He promised.

I was rebellious, hard headed, and stubborn. I didn't like myself and tried to do things to make me feel better about myself. I tried to please everyone else but I didn't know who was good and who was bad for me. As a result, I spent many years on drugs and stealing and have been to jail and prison numerous times.

The last time I was sent to prison was December 19, 2011, for 15 months. But by this time I was tired and ready to change. My son told me about the RSAT program to treat prisoners who are substance abusers. It helped me to look at myself in a deeper way and see what needed to be changed. As part of this program I had to write my life story and read it to the group. Reading my life story out loud was shocking to me and made me take a really hard look at myself. I decided to deal with my problems so I could heal.

I had been to Emmaus House before and they didn't want to take me back because of my repeated relapses but I finally convinced them that I had really changed and they took me in. Emmaus House is a strong link in my recovery. I am now a house manager at Emmaus. I love to encourage the other women in their recovery because I've been where they are.
